ADDITIONAL BYELAW MADE BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE
ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY OF THE COUNTY PALATINE OF
LANCASTER, UNDER PART XII OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT
ACT, 1933.

INTERFERENCE WITH STREET WARNING APPARATUS.

No person shall in any street to the obstruction, annoyance or danger of the residents or passengers, without lawful authority, move or tamper with any lamp, reflector or other apparatus used for giving warning of, or lighting, any obstruction, excavation or other danger.

As a result of the Criminal Justice Act, 1967, the maximum penalty for an offence against this byelaw/these byelaws is increased from £5 to £20 as from the 1st January, 1968.

EXTENT.

This byelaw shall have effect throughout the Administrative County of the County Palatine of Lancaster, except within the boundaries of any Municipal Borough.

The Common Seal of the County Council for the Administrative County of the County Palatine of Lancaster was hereunto affixed in pursuance of a Resolution of the said County Council passed at a meeting duly convened and held on the sixth day of May, one thousand, nine hundred and sixty-five.
