PREVENTION OF NUISANCES.

ADDITIONAL BYELAW MADE BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE
ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY OF THE COUNTY PALATINE OF LANCASTER
UNDER PART XII OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1933.

*Preservation of Road Margins Laid Out for
Ornamental Purposes.*

No person shall without lawful authority drive or place a vehicle, or cause a vehicle to be driven or placed, upon any road margin to which this byelaw applies, in such a manner as to injure or be likely to injure any turf or any tree, shrub or plant growing thereon.

Interpretation and Extent of Byelaw.

This Byelaw applies to any road margin in the areas described in the Schedule to this Byelaw and which is :—

1.—In or beside a public road other than a trunk road vested in the Minister of Transport ;

2.—Laid or sown with grass or planted with trees, shrubs or plants, and maintained in good order for ornamental purposes ;

and

3.—Indicated to be a margin to which this Byelaw applies by means of notices conspicuously displayed on or near the said margin by the appropriate Urban or Rural District Council.

As a result of the Criminal Justice Act, 1967, the maximum penalty for an offence against this byelaw/these byelaws is increased from £5 to £20 as from the 1st January, 1968.

Penalty.

Every person offending against this Byelaw shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £5.

Revocation of Byelaw.

The additional Byelaw made by the County Council of the Administrative County of the County Palatine of Lancaster on the twenty-sixth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-two, for Preservation of Road Margins Laid Out for Ornamental Purposes, under Part XII of the Local Government Act, 1933, is hereby revoked.

The Common Seal of the County Council of the Administrative County of the County Palatine of Lancaster was hereunto affixed in pursuance of a Resolution of the said County Council passed at a Meeting duly convened and held on the twenty-eighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six.
