ADDITIONAL BYELAW FOR GOOD RULE AND GOVERNMENT  
AND PREVENTION OF NUISANCES.

Additional Byelaw made by the County Council for the  
Administrative County of the County Palatine of Lancaster under  
Part XII of the Local Government Act, 1933.

*Prevention of Noise on Lakes.*

No person shall on the lake known as Coniston Water situated  
in the Rural District of Ulverston cause a boat to be propelled by an  
internal combustion engine unless the engine is fitted with a silencer  
suitable and sufficient for reducing as far as may be reasonable the  
noise caused by the escape of exhaust gases from the engine.  
Provided that this byelaw shall not apply to any person undertaking  
an attempt on a British National and/or World Water Speed Record,  
officially approved by and held under the rules and supervision of the  
Marine Motoring Association of Great Britain or the Union of  
International Motorboating.

Any person offending against this byelaw shall be liable on  
summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

**As a result of the Criminal Justice Act, 1967, the maximum  
penalty for an offence against this byelaw/these byelaws is  
increased from £5 to £20 as from the 1st January, 1968.**

The Common Seal of the County Council for the Administrative County of the County Palatine of Lancaster was hereunto affixed in pursuance of a Resolution of the said County Council passed at a Meeting duly convened and held on the fifth day of February, one thousand ninehundred and fifty-nine.
